# Thesis

Evangelicals' identification levels with basic personal values will not have as much of an impact on vote choice as the other independent variables will have.

# Literature Review: Schwartz's Value Theory

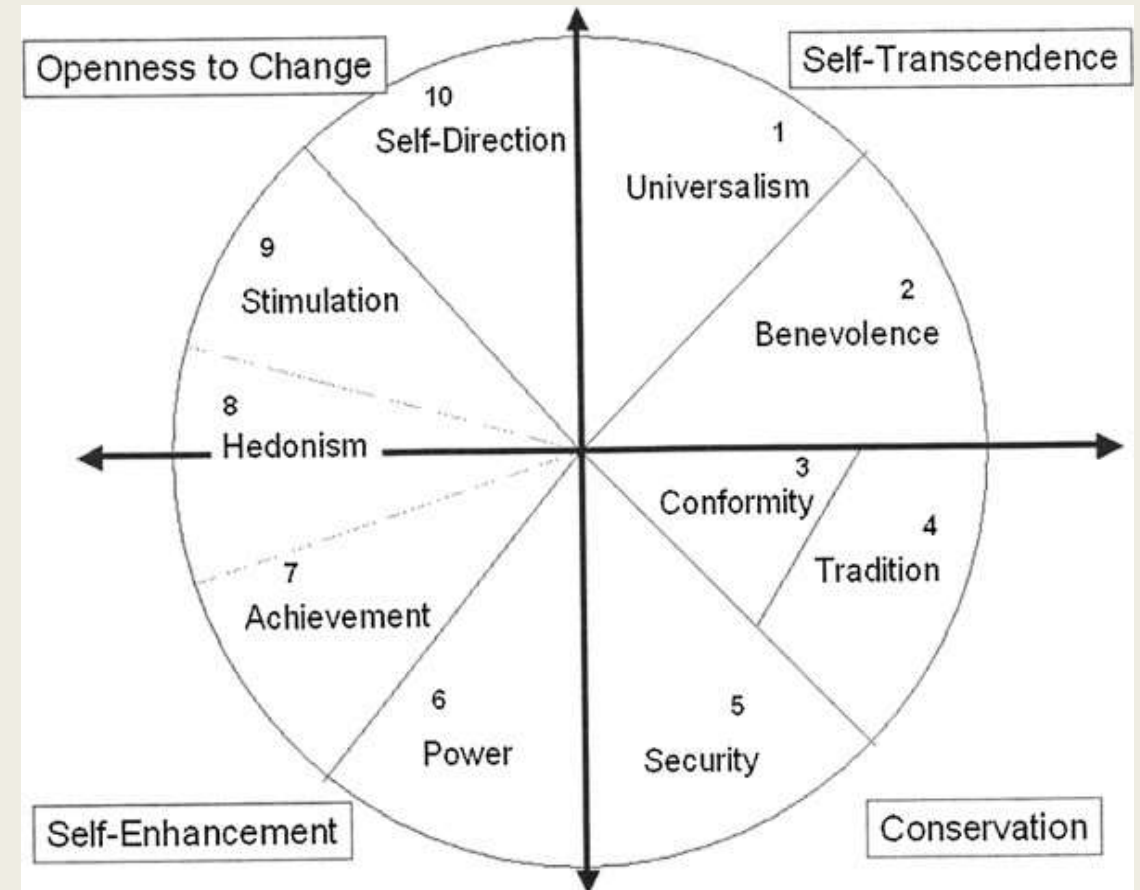

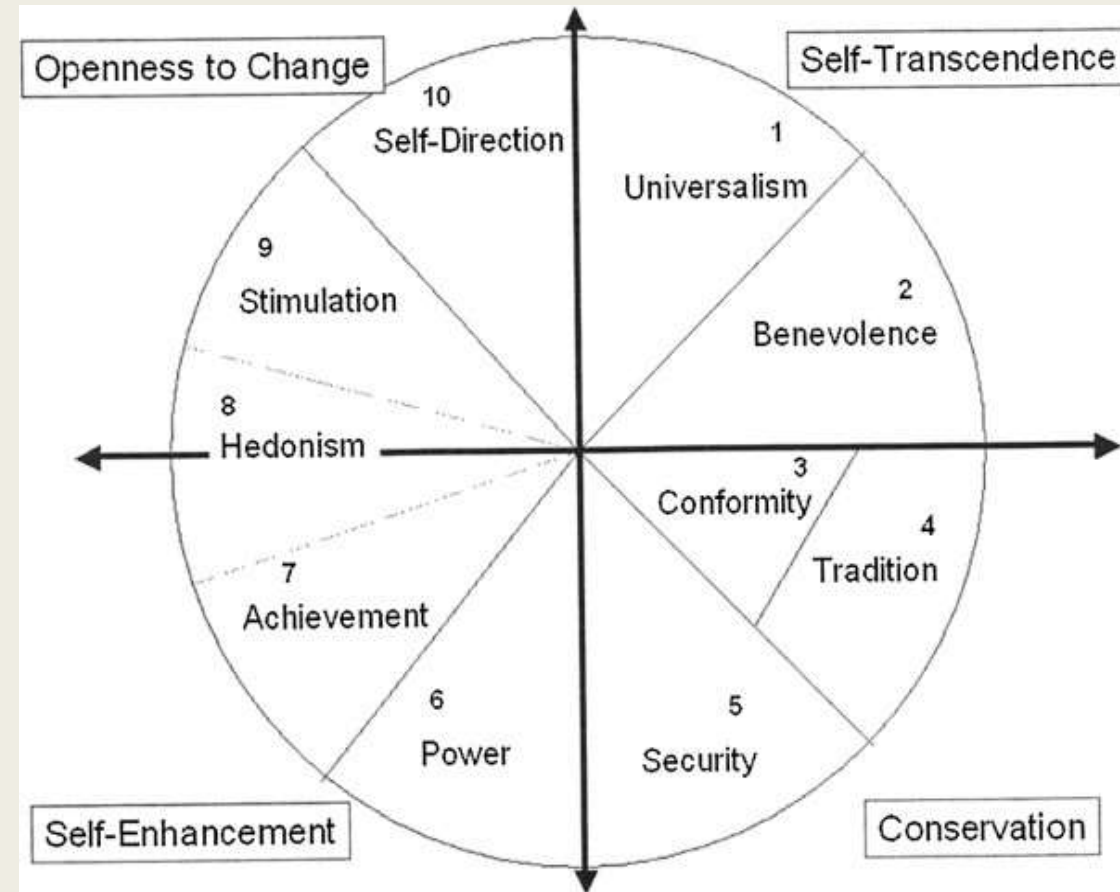
# Schwartz's Value Theory

- **Self-Direction:** Independent thought and action; choosing, creating, exploring.
- **Stimulation:** Excitement, novelty, and challenge in life.
- **Hedonism:** Pleasure and sensuous gratification for oneself.
- **Achievement:** Personal success through demonstrating competence according to social standards.
- **Power:** Social status and prestige, control or dominance over people and resources.
- **Security:** Safety, harmony, and stability of society, of relationships, and of self.
- **Conformity:** Restraint of actions, inclinations, and impulses likely to upset or harm others and violate social expectations or norms.
- **Tradition:** Respect, commitment, and acceptance of the customs and ideas that traditional culture or religion provide the self.
- **Benevolence:** Preserving and enhancing the welfare of those with whom one is in frequent personal contact.
- **Universalism:** Understanding, appreciation, tolerance, and protection for the welfare of all people and for nature.



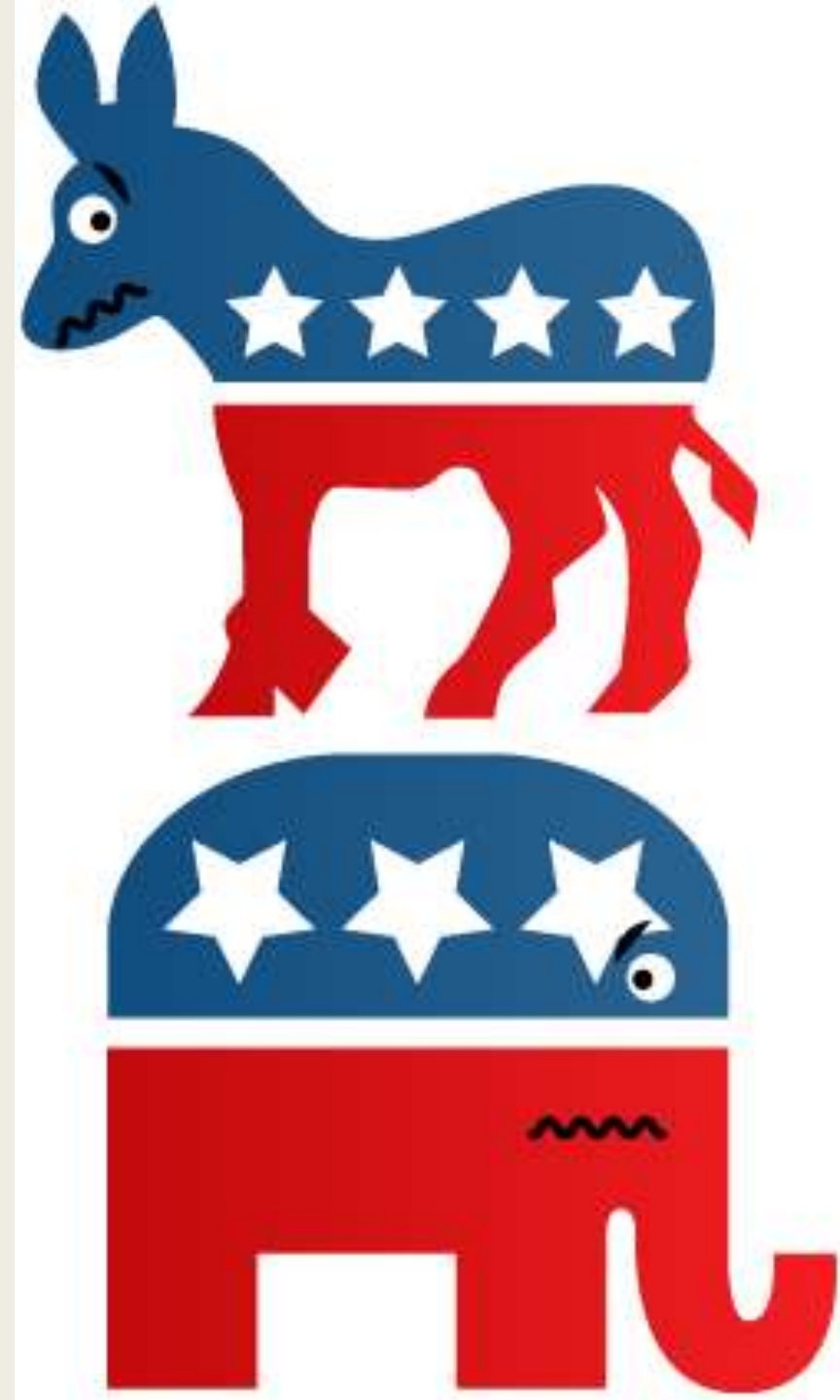
# Schwartz's Value Theory

- Schwartz et al, 2017; Goren et al, 2016—Basic personal values and core political values are entwined
- Feldman, 2003—Some values influence political beliefs and policy opinions more than others
  - Self-transcendence vs. conservation axis

- Niemi and Weisberg, 1976—Elite vs. mass belief systems
- Many Influences on Vote Choice
  - Party ID
    - Sears and Levy, 2003—generational effects and age cohorts
    - Abramowitz and Saunders, 1998—ideological and issue-position differences

### – Political Ideology

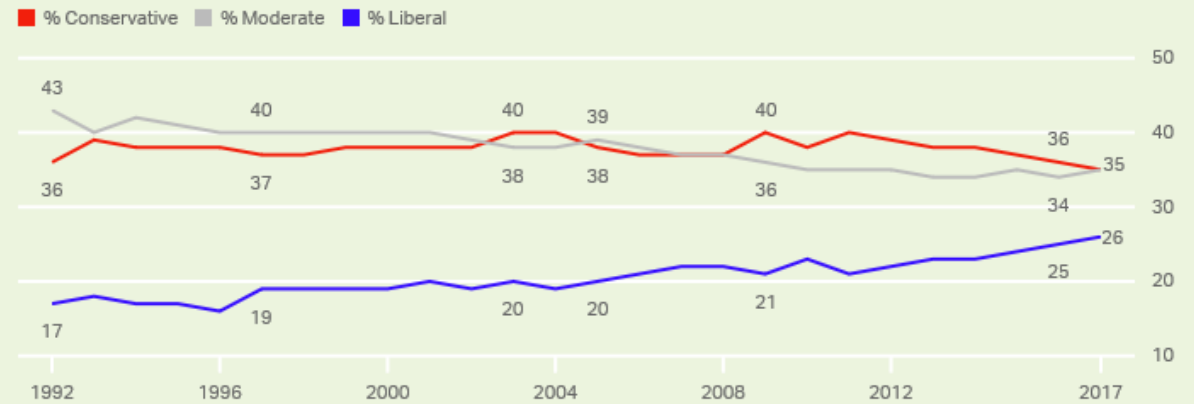
- Bardes and Oldendick, 2017—ideological identification and party identification
